When I arrive, I will park in a nearby lot or on the street. I might have to park a few blocks away and walk for a while to get to the stadium. If I need help, I can ask the person I am with.



When I get to the stadium, there will be a lot of people waiting to get into the game. It may feel busy or loud. I can stay close to the person I came with. I can bring comfort items with me.



There are rules about what I can bring into the stadium. I may see a sign that lists these items. These rules help keep everyone safe.

APPROVED ITEMS

Exceptions can be made for medically necessary items, provided they undergo proper inspection and are approved by security.



CLEAR BAGS
Maximum Size: 12" x 12" x 6"



SMALL CLUTCH, PURSES AND WALLETS
Maximum Size: 4.5" x 6.5"

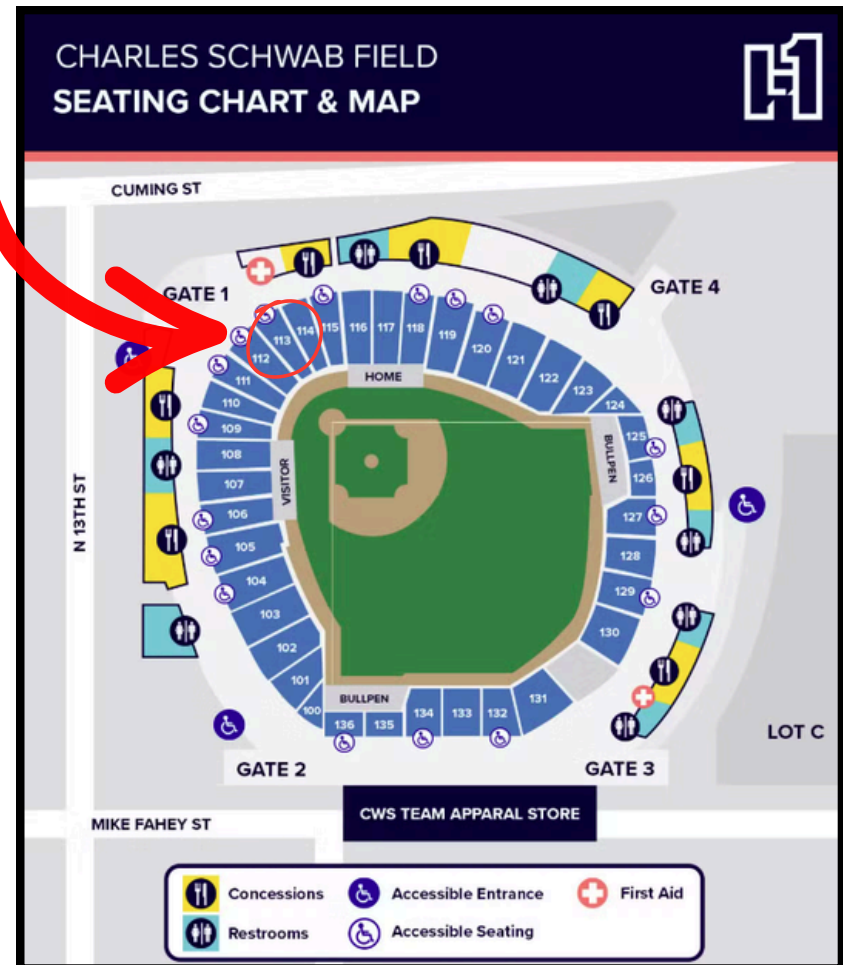
Before I go inside, a worker will scan my ticket on my phone. Then, I will walk through a metal detector. It may beep or light up. If needed, I may be asked to walk through again. Workers do this to help keep everyone safe.



It will be loud once I am inside the stadium. I can walk around, buy food, or go straight to my seat. I can get up and move around the concourse as much as I need.



I can check out a sensory kit at Guest Services near Section 113. The sensory kit has items that can help me feel more comfortable. I will return it to any staff member when I am done using it.



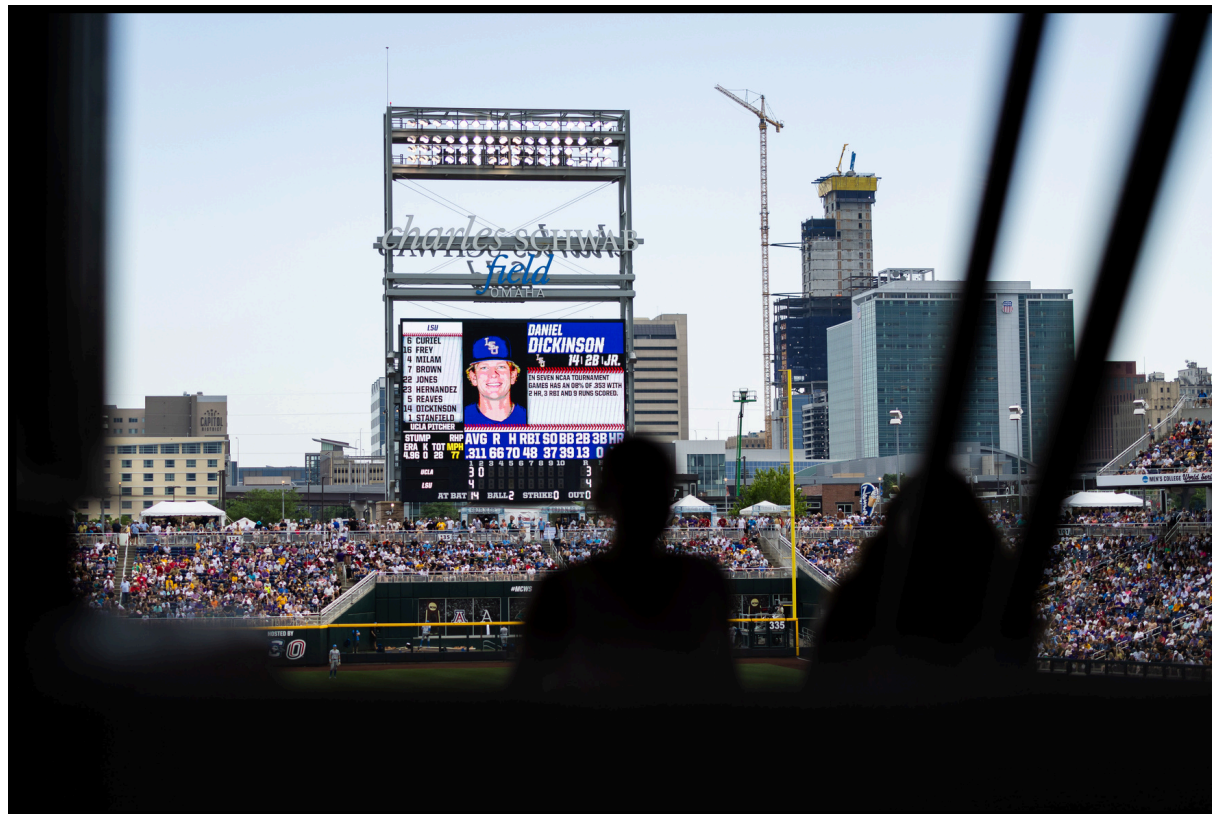
Before the game starts, the National Anthem will play. People stand, remove their hats, and place their hands over their hearts.



During the game, there will be lots of clapping, cheering, and loud music. They will announce what is happening during the game. I can cover my ears or use headphones if I need to.



I can look at the large scoreboard and follow the game. I can take breaks on the concourse and wear noise-cancelling headphones if I need.



I can get up as much as I need during the game to grab more snacks, use the restroom, or take a break away from the noise. I might have to be careful walking around the people sitting in my row.



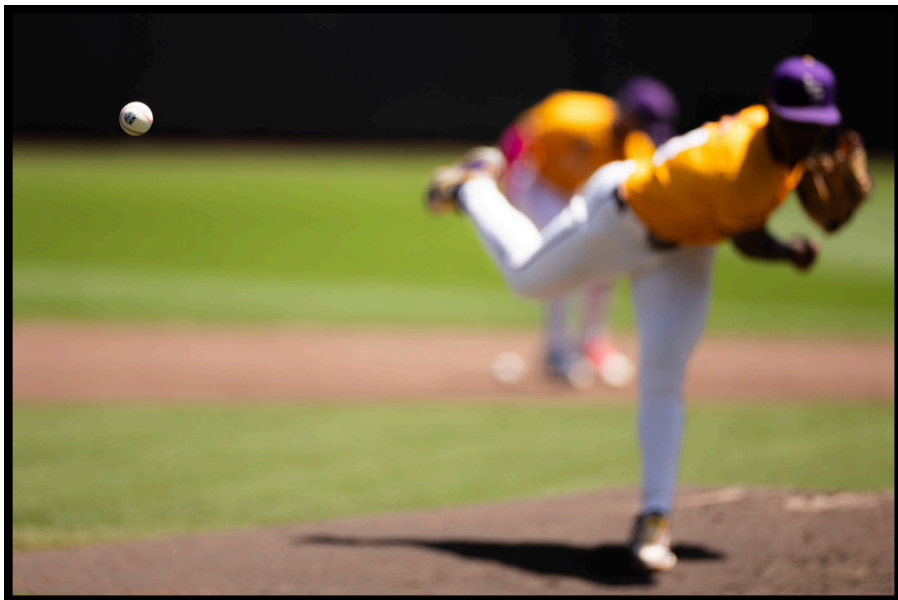
There will also be people walking around selling food and drinks to people in the stands. They may call out loudly to get attention. I can choose if I want to buy something.



I may see people in mascot costumes walking around. I can ask to take a picture with them, give them a high five, or wave at them. I do not have to do this if I don't want to.



I can cheer as much or as little as I would like. I can celebrate my favorite team in my own way.



After the game, people will stand up and start moving toward the exits. It will be crowded with everyone leaving at the same time. I can wait in my seat for some people to leave.
